


Fun for all age groups at Dinosaur Hill!

Jun 20-23 DINO MIGHT

Dig for dino bones, put a dinosaur skeleton together, take part in a dinosaur walk relay race, & create your own dinosaur tail in this prehistoric program.

Jun 27-30 NATURE CRAFTS Jr.

For the extra crafty kids! We'll discover creative ways to use stones, soil, and plant parts to create artwork. Hike to gather natural objects that we'll use to design animals, create paintings, and decorate a bird feeder.

July 11-14 SAVING THE PLANET Jr.

We'll discuss how the choices we make can help the planet. Get dirty making compost and planting a seed, make a plastic bottle into something new, and go on a litter scavenger hunt.

July 18-21 STARSTRUCK

July 18-21 LET'S ROCK

Discover how volcanoes, water, and wind shape our world. We'll break open geodes, polish stones, make rock candy, and identify different minerals.

Aug 1-4 ANIMALS INSIDE OUT

How do our senses compare to other animals? Give your senses a workout with our echolocation obstacle course and scent & seek games. Examine skulls and other parts and guess which sense are important for that animal.

Aug 15-18 BIGGER & BUGGIER

Meet our resident movie stars up close. Use nets to sweep for insects in the understory and in the creek. Turn logs. We'll safely capture and identify what we find, and turn them loose at the end of the day. Build a bug habitat and watch some very hungry caterpillars grow.

Eco-Friendly Birthday Party Rental

A birthday party at Dinosaur Hill is a memorable experience! You may choose between Dino Adventure, Explore Michigan Wildlife, Pirate Party, or Investigate Insects. Party fee includes compostable paper goods, decorations, non-plastic party favors and your own naturalist who leads the group in indoor and outdoor activities related to the theme. Please call or visit the nature center for availability.

Fee: \$150 2 hour rental, limit 25 people.

Evening Campfire Rentals

Enjoy a naturalist guided evening hike & campfire. Firewood, roasting sticks, and marshmallows are provided. Building is open for restroom use.

All rentals with campfires require 7 day notice.

Fee: \$150 2 hour rental, limit 40 people.

Nature Center Overnight Rental

Enjoy a naturalist guided evening hike, campfire, & craft. Firewood, roasting sticks, and marshmallows are provided. After the fire, board games are available, as well as viewing of resident nocturnal animal ambassadors before spreading our sleeping bags inside the exhibit room.

All rentals with campfires require 7 day notice.

Fee: \$250 12 hour rental, 8-8 or 9-9; limit 15 people.

Directions to Dinosaur Hill

Dinosaur Hill is located at 333 North Hill Circle in the City of Rochester. From Rochester Rd. go West on Woodward (there is a light at this intersection. This is a residential side street, not the Woodward that runs through Detroit). From Woodward, turn right (North) on N. Oak Street. From N. Oak St. turn left (West) on North Hill Circle. North Hill Circle will dead-end in the Dinosaur Hill parking lot.
